- What information is required of the proposer's sub-consultants (engineers, landscape architects, etc). just a list of consultants to be retained, or should their experience and resumes be included also?
  - o See page 6 of the RFQ, under Proposal Contents, item A4.
- Does the firm's insurance information need to be attached to the proposal? Consultants insurance?
  - o Yes, please see page 7 of the RFQ, item 11
- Is there a page limit for proposals?
  - o No limit
- I noticed there isn't really a section dedicated to past projects. I realize there's a section called A. Experience and Qualifications, which does ask for education, training, experience of key personnel (which we would typically include on their resume). Can we include a list of relevant projects and photo highlight pages within this section?
  - O Yes, that would be a good place to include that information.
- I noticed there isn't any information regarding teaming with subconsultants. Should we include this information under #A-4, and should we provide an organizational chart of our team?
  - Yes, that would be a good place for this and an organizational chart of your team would be helpful.
- Regarding #8 in section A, can we attach Architect licenses in this section?
  - Yes
- Regarding #9, do we need to acknowledge this statement as a response?
  - You can
- May we add project descriptions and other data to respond to the Evaluation Criteria that is not stipulated in the Proposal Requirements? If so, is the location of the information at our discretion?
  - Yes, that will be fine and the location of the information can be at your discretion.
- Would you like us to include profiles and resumes for our consultants?
  - Yes, that would be helpful.
- The Non-Collusive and Non-Solicitation Affidavit does not have a signature line for the affiant on the form. Please reissue a new form with a signature line.



- o 17.0 There are two Sections numbered 17.0. One is titled "COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS" and the other is titled "BONDS." Please clarify.
  - Both sections 17.0 have been removed. See revised Professional Services Contract
- 17.0 In Section 17.0 that's titled "COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS" the term "CONTRACTOR" is used in lieu of Consultant. Please confirm that this was meant to read "CONSULTANT."
  - This section has been removed. See revised Professional Services Contract
- 17.0 The 17.0 titled "BONDS" needs clarification as Bonds are not provided by Architects. Please clarify.
  - This section has been removed. See revised Professional Services Contract
- 17.1 This section contains multiple references to "Contractor." It also references bonds, which are not provided by the Architect. Please clarify.
  - This section has been removed. See revised Professional Services Contract
- 17.2 This section addresses performance and payment bonds to be provided by the Contractor. Architects do not provide such bonds. Please clarify.
  - This section has been removed. See revised Professional Services Contract


Hahnville Branch Library Community Input Survey Results January 17, 2023

## Q1: Do you have a St. Charles Parish Library Card?




### Q2: What branch(es) do you visit most often (select all that apply)?



### Q3: How often do you visit any of the St. Charles Parish Library branches?




## Q4: How many times have you or a member of your household visited the Hahnville Branch Library in the past year?




### Q9: How important are weekend hours at the Hahnville Branch Library to you?




#### Q10: How important are evening hours at the Hahnville Branch Library to you?



# Q11: What hours would you be most likely to visit a new Hahnville Branch Library (select all that apply)




